

Omri Lulav - curriculum vitae

Mr. Omri Lulav serves as managing director of the National Coal Ash Board (NCAB), a governmental agency that was established in 1993 by the Ministry of Energy and Infrastructures (known today as the Ministry of National Infrastructures), in cooperation with the Ministry of the Environment, the Interior Ministry, the Israel Electric Company (IEC) and the National Coal Supply Company (NCSC), with the objective of coordinating a national effort to solve the problem of ash that is accumulating at the coal-fired power stations. Mr. Lulav holds the NCAB's managing office since 1995, when he stepped into this position after a sudden death of Moshe Shamir of blessed memory, NCAB's first manager.
