

Arie Neiger, Advocate

Mr. Neiger serves as legal counsel to the National Coal Ash Board. Mr. Neiger heads the law firm of Arie Neiger, Advocates, where his practice encompasses a broad range of environmental matters, including administrative and constitutional litigation pertaining to environmental legislation and standard setting, toxic torts and criminal matters.

Mr. Neiger was among the founders of the Nature Preservation Department of the Society for the Protection of Nature in Israel (SPNI), and has been involved in the area of environmental quality for more than 30 years. Mr. Neiger completed his law studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in 1985 and clerked in the Supreme Court for the late Justice Dov Levine, and at the Herzog, Fox and Neeman Adv. After that time He specialized in administrative law at the Washington D.C. office of Fried, Frank, Harris, Shriver and Jacobson, USA, between the years 1988 to 1990, and is licensed to practice law in the state of New York.

Mr. Neiger is the principal environmental and legislation counsel to the Israel Manufacturers Associations and to the Israel Institute of energy and environment. In the Private sector his clients include the Israel Corporation, Israel Chemicals, Haifa Oil Refinery, Coor Industries, Tadiran Batteries, Taro, Vishey Israel, Paz Oil group, Dor group, Tnuva and Frutarom. In the public sector his clients include municipal authorities, government owned companies and hospitals.

Mr. Neiger lectures on the area of environmental protection at the Ono Academic College, Ben Gurion University and in various courses. He has published compedia of legislation and articles on the subject. Neiger is a reserve colonel in the IDF, and was a (reserve) brigade commander until the end of 2003.
